# **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Respiratory therapists are <u>licensed health professionals</u> who care for patients with cardiopulmonary disorders such as asthma, emphysema, prematurity, and trauma. Therapists work in various settings, including intensive care units, emergency departments, cardiopulmonary diagnostic and sleep disorder laboratories, community hospitals, clinics, and home care. The program is nationally recognized for successful outcomes. The program also includes approximately 1000 hours of supervised clinical practice in hospitals, nursing homes, and community agencies.

# **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

# GPA of 2.50 or higher

A minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA is required in all coursework taken at any accredited institution.

# **Prerequisite Courses**

Before starting the professional program, all prerequisite courses or equivalents must be completed with a C- or higher.

# **Online Application**

The <u>application</u> is available online and must be completed and submitted with all required supplemental documents, if applicable. Application FAQ can be found <u>here</u>.

A personal interview will be offered to competitive applicants. Knowledge of the profession and personal career goals will be evaluated then. The program will give individual consideration in the admission assessment to courses taken and applicant experiences.

# PREREQUISITE COURSES

These courses must be completed before beginning the professional program. Ohio State course numbers are shown below.

# **Second Year Prerequisites**

First-year (freshman) students may apply to the Respiratory Therapy program if they have completed the first-year prerequisite courses or their equivalent with a C- or higher by the end of Spring of their first year. If admitted by this path, students will complete the secondyear prerequisites, then begin the program in their third (junior) year

# **APPLICATION DEADLINE**

The Respiratory Therapy program admits students once per year, with students beginning the program in the Autumn semester. The application deadline for Autumn 2024 is January 31, 2024. The professional program will begin on August 20, 2024.

# **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

The minimum hours to graduate from The Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Science in Health and Rehabilitation Sciences is 120 credit hours. The Respiratory Therapy program requires 132 credit hours, not including HTHRHSC 1100.

Students should reference their <u>degree audit</u> to ensure they complete all required degree components. This includes general education, program prerequisites, and professional curriculum.

\*Students will take thematic courses in the *Citizenship for a Diverse and Just World* Theme (4-6 hours) and in one additional Theme of their choosing (4-6 hours).

The above plan demonstrates how students may complete the Respiratory Therapy program in nine semesters, including one summer term. It is assumed that students following this plan who are admitted to the program will begin professional coursework in the autumn semester of year three. There is flexibility in when a student may take courses in years one and two. However, in years three and four, the curriculum is more structured with limited ability to change. Students may choose to take non-professional courses over summer terms. It is highly recommended that students take all GE courses before starting the professional program. The professional curriculum is completed in sequence, and there is no provision for part-time or evening-only enrollment. Students who intend to transfer credit to Ohio State may view how credit is accepted on Transferology.com.

Ohio State academic programs are designed to prepare students to sit for applicable licensure or certification in Ohio.
