The focus of this online course is on recognizing health inequalities locally and beyond. Students will examine <u>why</u> communities in both, the Global North and South are not having <u>equitable</u> access to <u>high-quality</u> health services and most importantly <u>what can be done</u> to promote equity. Key topics include maternal and child health, infectious and chronic diseases, nutrition, sanitation and access to safe water, and environmental health. Class discussions and activities incorporate critical perspectives on social determinants of health in developing and developed countries.

Course objectives:

Human health & wellbeing: Successful students will explore social, economic, political and environmental
factors that affect how people experience health and have a major impact in their lives and wellbeing.
The in-depth exploration will be done from a social justice and systemic perspective addressing access, or
lack thereof, to opportunities.
