
The Ohio State University

Join an innovative, highly productive and collaborative faculty, and contribute to the continued growth of the Doctorate of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program and the PhD in Health and Rehabilitation Sciences. The Division seeks to hire one tenure track faculty member at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full Professor and one at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor.

The Division of Occupational Therapy in the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences (SHRS) is located in a large, energetic academic medical center and research extensive university, offering an array of collaboration and innovation opportunities. The successful candidate will join a community of scholars committed to excellence in research, teaching and professional leadership in one of the country's most established OT programs. The Division of Occupational Therapy offers an entry-level occupational therapy doctorate and a dual-degree OTD – PhD track. Faculty also teach and advise students in the SHRS interdisciplinary PhD in Health and Rehabilitation Sciences.

The successful candidate will be immersed in a culture of scientific discovery and innovation across a broad range of focus areas. In AY2017, faculty research was supported by 21 grants and contracts, division faculty had 45 publications and faculty gave 49 national and international presentations. In addition, The Ohio State University OTD program highly values teaching excellence and professional leadership. Ohio State OT is ranked 12th nationally, boasts 100% NBCOT pass rate success in 2016 and 2017, offers a multitude of simulation, didactic and clinical experiences to our students; as well as multiple opportunities for specialization in research, rehabilitation engineering, pediatrics and neurorehabilitation.
