

Driving Directions

to Comprehensive Transplant Center
Beavercreek Health Center

From the North (Troy area, Piqua)

Take any major highway to Interstate 75 S
Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 54B
Merge onto OH-4 N toward Springfield
Take the exit toward W.P.A.F.B. Area a-C
Merge onto OH-444 N
Turn right onto Kauffman Rd.
Turn right onto National Rd.
Continue onto Grange Hall Rd.
Use the left 2 lanes to turn left onto Pentagon Blvd.
Turn right onto Commons Blvd.
Beavercreek Health Center will be on the left.

From the South (Cincinnati, Clarksville, Centerville)

Take any major highway to Interstate 675 N
Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 17 for N Fairfield Rd.
Use the right 2 lanes to turn right onto N Fairfield Rd.
Turn right onto Commons Blvd.
Beavercreek Health Center will be on the right.

From the East (Springfield, Circleville, Lancaster area)

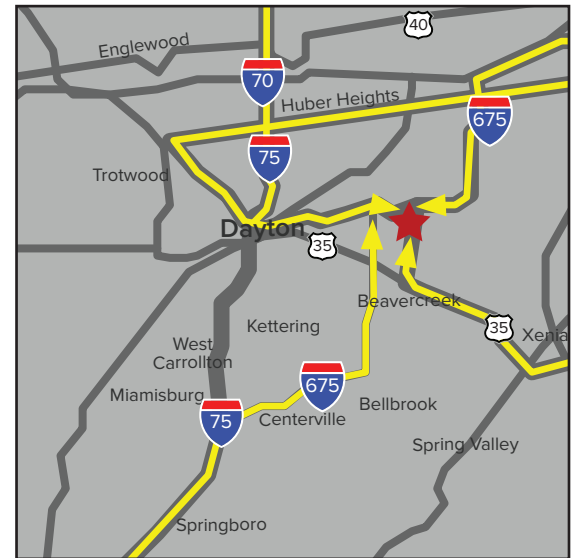
Take any major highway and merge onto I-70 W/OH-4 W
Take the I-675 S exit toward Cincinnati
Continue onto I-675 S
Take exit 17 for N Fairfield Rd.
Turn left onto N Fairfield Rd.
Turn right onto Commons Blvd.
Beavercreek Health Center will be on the right.

From the West (Dayton and Eaton area)

Take any major highway to US-35 E/E Main St.
Turn right to stay on US-35 E
Keep left to stay on US-35 E
Use the right 2 lanes to merge onto I-675 N toward Columbus
Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 17 for N Fairfield Rd.
Use the right 2 lanes to turn right onto N Fairfield Rd.
Turn right onto Commons Blvd.
Beavercreek Health Center will be on the right.

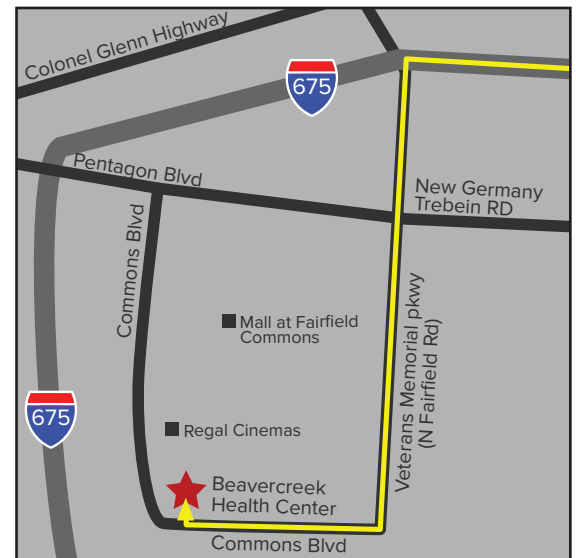
