


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Patient Diagnosis Breakdown




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
Every Patient at OSUWMC Outpatient Rehabilitation is evaluated and an individualized Plan of Care is developed for them in conjunction with their therapist(s). Within that plan, goals are set and agreed upon by the patient and their therapist(s) and a Predicted Outcome is established. In Fiscal Year 2017 88% of our neurologic patients met their predicted outcome.



This graph indicates the overall patient satisfaction for Fiscal Year 2017 for neurologic conditions.




This graph shows our patients with neurologic diagnoses "likelihood of recommending" our services to others for Fiscal Year 2017.





The number of therapy visits varies for every individual. These numbers are determined by diagnosis, goals, progress and insurance. Below are the averages for therapy visits by discipline (Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy). As each patient is an individual, so are the respective number of treatment sessions that they will receive for an episode of care. Treatment session range from 2 (for things like establishing a home exercise program) to over 100 (for a complex injury).



Average Number of Visits

During Fiscal Year 2017 we served patients from a majority of the 88 Ohio counties. Although the majority of our patients were Franklin County, we served patients from a total of 88 different counties from many surrounding states including Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Indiana, Virginia, West Virginia, Illinois and beyond.
