

## AGING MINOR AT THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY

## **Advising Sheet for Aging Minor (Semesters)**

The School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences Revised April 2013

**Introduction:** According to the US Administration on Aging, the older population--persons 65 years or older--numbered 39.6 million in 2009. They represented 12.9% of the U.S. population, about one in every eight Americans. By 2030, there will be about 72.1 million older persons, more than twice their number in 2000. The population 65+ is expected to grow to be 19% of the population by 2030. In Ohio, 1.5 million people were age 65 and over in 2010, and Ohio has the 7<sup>th</sup> largest older population in the nation.

This minor prepares our undergraduate students to pursue graduate opportunities in fields with a gerontology focus, such as medicine, allied medical professions, nursing, pharmacy, psychology, social work, consumer sciences, anthropology, and sociology. The minor also positions students well to enter the work force in jobs engaged with the elderly. It is expected that there will be an increasing need for individuals with this more specialized knowledge base in the workforce.
